



## MEDICAID ENROLLEES NEED CLINICAL TRIAL ACCESS

Clinical trials often provide the best treatment options for patients with life-threatening conditions. But many can't enroll because federal law doesn't require Medicaid to cover the routine costs of participating.



### Cost is one of the biggest barriers

to clinical trial participation—particularly for low-income patients.<sup>2</sup>



Medicaid is the only major payer that doesn't guarantee coverage of routine care costs for trial participants.












All other major payers—including Medicare—cover these costs.

Covering routine costs would have a minimal impact on overall Medicaid spending; Medicaid covers these costs for patients who do not enroll in trials.<sup>3,4</sup>

# Closing this coverage gap would reduce racial/ethnic disparities and improve the validity of data and the quality of new treatments.

Minorities are underrepresented in clinical research.



Passage of the bipartisan CLINICAL TREATMENT ACT (H.R. 913/S. 4742) would put clinical trials within reach of millions more patients—including children, people with disabilities, and rural Americans.
