ONCOLOGY SPECIALIST CARE

- Follow-up care occurs in the oncology setting with treating oncologist
- Can be implemented in private practice, community hospitals or cancer centers
- Can be implemented in disease-specific clinics or modality-specific practices
- Communication and coordination with PCP

 Comfortable for patients and family/caregivers who have developed a relationship with the treating oncologist Provides continuity of oncology care Oncologist may continue to care or follow their patients Patients at high risk of recurrence are closely followed 	 Not a sustainable model of care Focus remains on illness, not wellness Focus may be on relapse rather than risk-based surveillance and health promotion Many survivors report significant unmet needs with this model of care Providers may lack time or interest in managing long- term or late effects May be difficult to focus on psychological support because typically medically focused care Primary care needs may be unmet Specific reimbursement codes for survivorship not available if provided within an existing appointment
