What is a CAC?

According to CMS' <u>Program Integrity Manual</u> (Section 13.2.4.3), "the purpose of the CAC is to provide a formal mechanism for healthcare professionals to be informed of the evidence used in developing the LCD and promote communications between the MAC and the healthcare community."

CACs are made up of healthcare professionals, beneficiary representatives, and medical organization representatives.
